
Tree City USA

Permits

City ordinance 905.07 PUBLIC TREE CARE PERMIT requires a permit for property owners that intend to plant, prune, maintain or remove a street tree or City tree. There is no fee for the application process. Permit application forms are available at the Service Center 415 S. Vandemark Road or on the City web page www.sidneyoh.com

Tree Ordinance

"Street trees" means trees, shrubs, bushes and all other woody vegetation on land lying within a city right-of-way, typically between the street curb and sidewalk. The Ordinance contains information regarding:

Correct Planting - Penalties
Tree Board - Arbor Day - Tree Care
Tree Topping - Tree Removal
Tree Species - Tree Care - Permits
Tree Damage - City Maintenance
Diseased Trees - Prohibited Trees

Asian Longhorned Beetle



This beetle attacks many species of hardwood trees including all maples, buckeye, horsechestnut, elm, poplar, sycamore and others. In June 2011, an infestation was found in Clermont County, Ohio. Emerald Ash Borer
